The II Polish-Hungarian Scientific Forum will present the results of comprehensive research conducted as part of the Polish-Hungarian Research Platform. This event will focus on detailed findings and conclusions, offering an in-depth look at the topics discussed during the first forum.

The session on the Reversed Rule of Law in Poland will provide a thorough analysis of the institutional and legal changes that have impacted the rule of law in Poland, drawing conclusions about their broader implications. Research on Changes in the Structure and Scope of Foreign Service Activity will offer a detailed assessment of how foreign services have evolved, with attention to strategic shifts and their effects on international relations. In the area of Child Welfare and Modern Technologies, researchers will present specific conclusions on how modern technologies influence child welfare, along with recommendations for safe and effective use of digital platforms. The forum will also address the Social Exclusion of Older People – Legal Responses, delivering data-driven recommendations to address social isolation and ensure legal protection for older adults. The session on Transnational Migration Crime will present an analysis of migration-related crime trends, emphasizing legal and cross-border cooperation strategies.

This event will provide a deeper examination of the research outcomes, offering concrete recommendations for policymakers and further strengthening cooperation between Polish and Hungarian academic communities.
